Dear Praying Friends,

We are so thankful for the care and concern of God's people during this time. Many churches and believers are dealing with more stringent restrictions that we, yet they have taken the time to check up on our situation so that they can pray more specifically. This has been a tremendous encouragement to us.

Progress Despite Pandemic

During the month of May we were working under Stage 1 of Alberta's reopening plan, which restricted us in many ways. Also, people were still very fearful due to the feeling stirred up by this pandemic, and have been reluctant to attend any in-person church service. We have continued to see a good number of people watching our live stream services, and we pray that the viewers from the local area will take the time to visit us as the reopening continues into Stages 2 & 3.

The Lord did allow us to begin meeting in our new facility during the month of May. We are grateful for various things (chairs, etc.) that were donated to us, and for the help of several of our church members to get everything into place. There was a lot of work involved in getting things ready to meet, but we are so very thankful to have a place of our own, where we can faithfully serve the Lord. We have tentative plans for a number of meetings and events that we would like to host, as soon as we are really back to normal. Please pray that these plans will result in the salvation of the lost and the strengthening of this church plant.

Health Issues

We have certainly been under physical duress these past several weeks. We believe that it is a part of the devil's attack on us, but we also want to be open to

what the Lord is teaching us through each circumstance.

First, Becky has been having dental issues for some time, but she put off the dreaded trip to the dentist as long as possible. Of course, dentists have been closed, being considered "non-essential," so we didn't have much possibility for her to find help until very recently. So far, she has had two teeth cut out, and will have two more cut out in the upcoming weeks. We thank the Lord for the two churches who sent to meet this need for her — **you are a great blessing to us!**



Second, after a busy weekend of distributing flyers and church services, I experienced great of pain in my left foot. When I went to the doctor, he ordered tests and found that 1) I have acute arthritis in that foot, and 2) I am dealing with bone spurs in the heel of that foot. The doctor told me that Alberta Health does not cover the bone spurs, so we were left to our own devices in dealing with it. So far, we have tried a couple of things that have given a great deal of relief to me. The arthritis, of course, comes and goes as it sees fit. I am not at 100% yet, but at least I do not need to sit when I preach or use a cane when I walk, as I was doing a short time ago. Please pray that this will not keep me from the work that needs to be done here in Edmonton.

We thank God for each one of you, and for your faithfulness to pray for us. We continue to stand in need of prayer!
